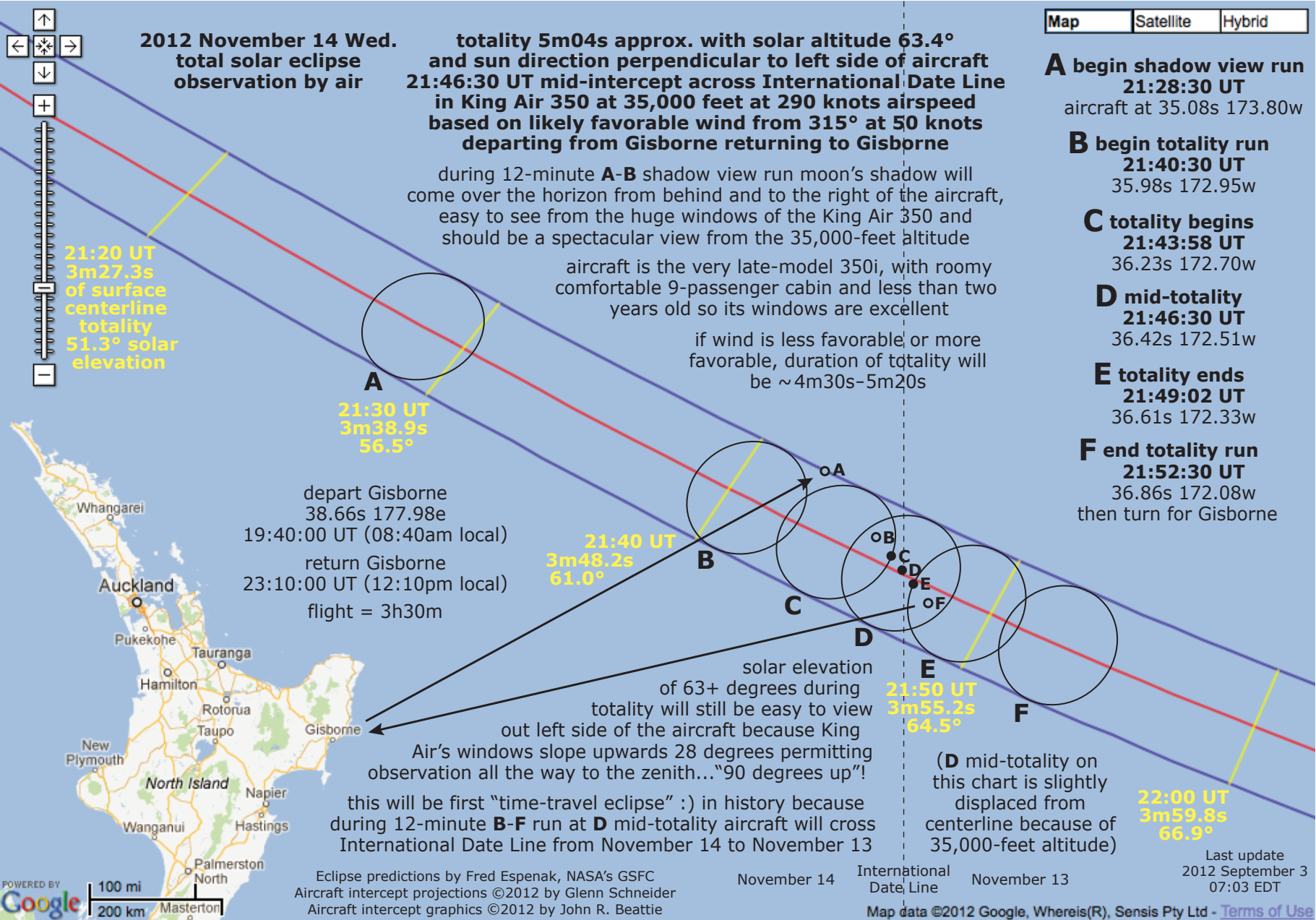

ECLIPSE FLIGHT NOVEMBER 14

from Gisborne to total solar eclipse – airborne observation over water east of NZ – more than 4.5 minutes in the moon’s shadow at 35,000 feet altitude at 290 knots in 9-passenger King Air 350 turboprop aircraft – unforgettable drama as shadow approaches and envelops aircraft – “closest we can come to space travel” \$3,000 for your own window or \$2,000 to share – windows are quite large so sharing should work fine 4 seats and 3 windows available [**Phil.Asker@captainschoice.com.au 0414 747 376**]



If the King Air 350 sells out, a second aircraft is available which will cost twice as much, \$6,000 per person – it’s a jet, can fly to 45,000 feet not just 35,000 feet – it will fly if at least 6 of its 7 seats are sold by Nov-12.
